<div>Details of Disappearance</div> <p>Nahida Khatib vanished on October 1, 1976, from her home in the <u>4000 block of Menomonee River Parkway</u>. She left behind her purse, keys, shoes and clothes. Food, ready to be cooked, sat on the stove and meat was left thawing on the counter top. There was a half-empty cup of coffee. Her 2-year-old niece was unattended in a playpen. The only items missing were Nahida's furry slippers and bathrobe. After 10 years of marriage, Nahida was in the throes of a nasty divorce from her husband. From the beginning detectives suspected foul play. Investigators believed that Khatib's husband was involved in her disappearance. Immediately after police started questioning the husband about the disappearance of Nahida, he retained a defense lawyer and questioning stopped. He was never charged with the crime; there was no evidence, no body or sign of struggle. Details of Disappearance

On December 10, 1993 deputies were contacted to check on the welfare of a 43-year-old man named Kim M. Klimek at his residence in the Village of Wales. Klimek's house appeared fine although there was no sign of him or his truck. There was evidence that he was packing for a planned trip to Las Vegas and the tickets were found at the residence; however, he never made the trip. His mailbox indicated there was mail from as far back as November 8, 1993. During the investigation, it was found that his truck was parked at Mitchell Airport, but there was no record of him taking any flights. No one has heard from Kim Klimek since 1993. There were significant events that occurred within Kim's family, which they believe, would have resulted in him contacting family members, but that did not happen. He was a self-employed drywaller [dba Perfection Drywall]. His family believed he was running away to Vegas to start over. He was in a small amount of tax debt but police don't believe it was enough to make him run and start over. They said they exhausted the Vegas angle. But see article.

Last seen about two weeks after his 43rd birthday, Klimek's activities around the date of his disappearance, Nov. 10, 1993, contradict a theory that investigators say is held by some friends and relatives — that the self-employed drywall contractor fled to Nevada and assumed another identity.

Those Klimek acquaintances note that he owed money to the Internal Revenue Service. However, Wepfer and Detective Karen Ruff are not convinced that the little bit of debt in Klimek's past would have led him to seek a new life in Las Vegas.

"The bottom line is there are facts inconsistent with him moving and assuming a new identity," Wepfer said. "There are people who are as concerned as are we that foul play may be involved."

Detectives became involved in the case after business associates who had not heard from him or seen him checked his home on Dec. 1, 1993. They found his mail piled up and his home messy and disturbed, although it had not been ransacked.

Detectives said they have exhausted the new-identity theory through contacts with Las Vegas police and Nevada law enforcement agencies and attempts to locate Klimek through Las Vegas casinos.

Details of Disappearance

Elizabeth was last seen leaving work at [Demco Plastics in DeForest](#) at approximately 3:15 p.m. on July 27, 2000. She was driving a borrowed green Jeep Cherokee with vanity license plates; it was later found abandoned on a parking ramp at Meriter Hospital in downtown Madison. She has never been heard from again and extensive searches of the area turned up no evidence as to her whereabouts. Elizabeth's husband of twelve years, Daniel H. Kutz, was arrested a day after his wife disappeared and charged with misdemeanor counts of stalking his wife and of obstructing an officer. He was charged with Elizabeth's murder a month later and convicted five months after that, in January 2001.

Daniel maintained that he and Elizabeth rode around in the Jeep Cherokee and discussed their failed marriage on the day of her disappearance, and she dropped him off at a gas station in Madison and said she would continue to Portage. He stated that he never saw her after that and he never harmed her. Daniel was picked up by police at 11:00 p.m. that day as he walked down the road, soaking wet, without shoes or a shirt. He said he had left his shoes in the Jeep Cherokee and was walking home, which was thirty miles away. Traces of Elizabeth's blood were found on Daniel's wristwatch after his arrest, and drops of her blood were in the storage area of the Jeep. The vehicle had been wiped clean of fingerprints on the inside, but Daniel's prints were found on its exterior. Daniel is serving a life sentence for Elizabeth's murder. He maintains his innocence in her case. Elizabeth's remains have never been found, but foul play is suspected in her case due to the circumstances involved.
